

Information from Andrew Leslie

Through the language of geometric abstraction, I have developed a system where wall-based objects use a hidden painted surface to project simple images onto the supporting wall using **ambient light**. The position of the viewer, the time of day, the nature of the space, the supporting wall and the reflected images are all fundamental components of the works.

The nature of the reflected image is informed by responses to specific events and actions. At the same time the interaction between the viewer and the painted objects acts as a model for the process by which we understand the world around us.

Studying

Making

Find examples of reflected colour and light upon different surfaces in ambient light.

Explore changes upon different surfaces (both rough and smooth textures) at different times of day and from different angles.

Use photography to record your discoveries.
