
President's message

Old Girl opportunities to support current students

Upon the retirement of Marg Selby, the AOGU is delighted to introduce Old Girl Vivienne Gilkes (2001) as Abbotsleigh's new Head of Careers Education and Post-School Opportunities. Not only is Viv an Old Girl, but she is also a member of the AOGU Committee, and her daughter Olive attends nursery class at the Abbotsleigh ELC. She has worked in Independent Schools for nearly 20 years and is already focused on getting to know the girls and the Abbotsleigh community in her new role.

One part of the AOGU's Connection Through Community vision is for Old Girls to connect with current girls, and not just via the swimming and athletics relay races! There are many ways that Old Girls can support current Abbotsleigh students to become the next generation of empowered female leaders, including:

1. Volunteer to speak at an Industry
Career Webinar. The days of Careers
Nights that most of us remember are
gone. The School now holds evening
Industry Career Webinars for interested
students in Years 9-12 where Old Girls
connect with current students to share their
career journey and post-school wisdom. As
they are online, it is a great opportunity
for Old Girls beyond Sydney to be involved
and we have had Old Girls join previous
webinars from rural areas, interstate and
even from a mining site overseas!

2. Offer to host a placement for Work

Experience. Year 10 girls complete Work Experience in May each year. This program is very effective in helping them explore career pathways that may be of interest before they need to make important subject decisions for Year 11. The girls particularly appreciate the connection and rich learning experience of being hosted by an Old Girl.

- 3. Connect as a representative of the tertiary sector. Old Girls who work in the tertiary sector are an invaluable connection for our current girls. You may like to offer to speak with a group of girls in person or virtually about the tertiary institution that you work for, or about working in that sector. Any insight into university studies and life makes the transition after Year 12 a less anxious experience for many girls.
- 4. Connect as a scholarship recipient or student at an international university. Many students strive to apply for scholarships, cadetships and international university admissions. Any advice, support or mentoring that Old Girls can provide would be of great benefit to our current girls.

Connecting and Celebrating: AOGU 110th Anniversary Grant recipient Karen Hamilton (Bootle, 1988)

Come and meet Karen Hamilton (Bootle, 1988) at the AOGU Speakers' Morning tea in the Marion Clarke Dining Hall, Friday 31 May at 10 am. Karen is the recipient of the sixth AOGU 110th Anniversary Grant which will support Karen's project offering a six-week Mindfulness and Meditation Program to cancer patients at the Western Cancer Centre in Dubbo. This Centre services an enormous rural area, consisting of many smaller outback towns. The program will be offered to cancer patients who are facing a challenging time, often away from home and it may be the catalyst for this type of program to be made available to other cancer patients in the future.

Karen is a breast cancer survivor who experienced the benefits of relaxation techniques while recovering in Sydney. Being passionate about the important role of these strategies in her recovery and knowing they are not widely available in rural areas, Karen transitioned from her career as a school teacher to being a mindfulness and meditation teacher. Her business, 'Harmonious Heart' offers community mindfulness and meditation classes in rural western NSW.

Karen will attend the Speakers' Morning Tea in person and talk about her mindfulness and meditation program for cancer patients and run one of her meditation sessions for attendees. The talk will also be available via Zoom for those not able to attend in person.

The purpose of the AOGU 110th Anniversary Grant is to support Old Girls to 'pay it forward through a project designed to benefit the community or have a positive social impact. As always, it is a privilege for the Anniversary Grant Sub-committee to learn how Old Girls are giving back to the community and taking steps to improve the world.

We would like to encourage Old Girls to apply for the 2024 AOGU 110th Anniversary Grant; applications will be called for later in the year. We thank all our applicants for taking the time to apply for the Grant, wish them all the best in their respective projects. We are very proud to call them Abbotsleigh Old Girls.
