Liz Anelli: As an illustrator and author Liz has over 20 children's books published around the globe. She creates her illustrations through drawing in pencil, watercolour and monoprinting. Liz is a Board Director of Australia Society of Authors, an Ambassador for Books in Homes and reviews picture books for CBCA. Lorena Carrington: Lorena is an internationally published photographic artist and illustrator, exhibiting her artwork in commercial and public art galleries. She produces her illustrations by photographing many separate elements and combining them in detailed montages. She contributes to arts and literary festivals, and has work held in Australian and International collections and frequently tours schools with presentations and workshops.

Tannya Harricks: Tannya is known for her expressive oil paintings that capture her subject with expressive, spontaneous gesture. She has been awarded the Waverley and Hornsby Art Prizes and has exhibited in Sydney, New Zealand and Italy. In 2019 the book *Dingo*, written by Claire Saxby with illustrations by Tannya Harricks was joint winner of the Patricia Wrightson Prize for Children's Literature at the NSW Premier's Literary Award. http://tannyaharricks.com/

Bethany Macdonald: Bethany is a collage artist, painter and printmaker, and she has exhibited her paintings, prints and drawings in solo exhibitions and group shows across Sydney. She works in traditional paper collage, painting and preparing varieties of paper and cardboard before tearing, cutting and assembling it to create her textured illustrations. Bethany has just co-written her first picture book.

Aura Parker: Aura is an author and illustrator of children's picture books and she uses watercolour, coloured pencil, artline pens, and digital compositions to create her detailed whimsical compositions.
