I start with an idea of a hat, this could be a movement, an image or a concept I wish to explore. I may create a block, use an existing block, or sit at the steamer and begin to form shapes. I play with **ideas** until I am happy with what I have created. This can be very quick, or I can spend hours over numerous sittings to achieve the desired piece.

I work intuitively most of the time. Sometimes I note down some very basic ideas of shapes, but seldom draw up my designs. I spend a lot of time looking at images of birds, insects, butterflies, moths and shells or whatever takes my interest.

Recently I have been inspired by origami art and I aim to capture the essence of these folds and shapes in my hats.

Studying

Fasten your chosen design with glue and tape.
