

## Braving the Waves is a good investment in the future you

We live in times and in a cultural setting where much energy is invested in seeking to eliminate the everyday challenges of life. While often well intentioned, this is thwarting young people's ability to build resilience and develop a toolkit for managing and even flourishing amid normal challenges. Missing out on selection in a team or ensemble, receiving a disappointing assessment result, needing to work productively in a group with others who are not your close friends, or experiencing a friendship that has not gone well are just a few of the normal everyday challenges faced by children and teenagers. The quote 'You can't stop the waves, but you can learn to surf them' (Jon Kabat Zinn) inspired our 2024 Prefects to adopt their own theme 'Brave the Waves' which is centred around developing courage, grit and resilience, and embracing the inevitable challenges of life.

On Monday, students from Years 6-12 gathered for the Brave the Waves Festival. The concept for this annual event was introduced in 2023 with the aim of celebrating and reinforcing the Prefect theme unique to each year. Year 12 girls and Prefects led a wide variety of activities aimed at character growth through facing and overcoming challenges and by connecting with others. The community enjoyed a massive obstacle course, 'Cinnamania' donut challenge, friendship bracelet making, karaoke, mural painting, cookie decorating and so much more. The Year



12 band 'CEEFOOD Allergy' created a vibrant atmosphere with a beautiful repertoire of music. It was also wonderful to see Year 6 students engaging energetically in the activities, as the Senior School welcomed them for the beginning of their orientation program.

Another highlight of the festival was the 100% sustainably made wave sculpture created by the Environment Council, led wonderfully by our Environment Prefect Alice Harrington, and with the enthusiastic support of the Abbotsleigh Maintenance Department. The Environment Council collected empty single use plastic bottles and featured them on the sculpture, drawing attention to the prominent issue of plastics in our waterways. The sculpture was painted by talented Senior School artists Meera Nirmalendran and Chloe Nicholls and included a surfboard platform for students to brave the wave for a photo shoot.

The festival was also a wonderful opportunity for Year 7 and Year 8 students to raise funds through food stalls and a barbecue. This money will contribute to their sponsorship of Elizabeth, Agness, Ntoji and Happiness at Bunda Girls' Secondary School, enabling these girls to receive a quality secondary education. Meanwhile, the Service Council sold badges for Bega kwa Bega, the name of our partnership with Bunda Girls' Secondary School, with the profits also supporting girls' education in Tanzania.

Overall, the festival was an awesome community event and a product of many peoples' hard work. The shared joy was evident on the smiling faces and in the reverberating laughter, and the drizzle did little to dampen spirits. We hope that this year's Brave the Waves festival will serve as a reminder of the importance of normalising everyday challenges and developing that all important toolkit that will lead to Abbotsleigh girls becoming strong and resilient young adults who are not thrown off course by the inevitable challenges of life.
