There were many takeaways from Bronte's presentation and Q and A session. Some of these include:

- Bronte's absolute love of and passion for swimming.
 This underpins everything she has done and continues to do.
- The self-regulation and incredible self-discipline required to be the best you can be.
- The importance of being a member of a team with every team member having absolute respect for each other.
- The wisdom of not wishing fellow team members 'good luck' prior to a race, as this virtually ignores talent and hard work; instead, saying 'I have your back', thus guaranteeing mutual respect and support no matter the outcome of the race.
- The courage and perseverance required to keep going even when faced with debilitating illness and extremely painful injuries.
- The ability to stare challenges squarely in the face and enjoy them – Bronte's characteristic smile (that apparently bothered her opponents) at the beginning of each race, is legendary. Bronte explained that she was able to smile and be excited about each race by remembering her 7-year-old self's great dream to be an Olympian; this made her smile with excitement rather than panic with stress before every race.



 The ability to take the inevitable disappointments in her stride and, as such, being able to turn what some might see as a 'crushing defeat' into a realistic 'washup' – What went well, what didn't, what I need to do to fix it.

Bronte's relaxed demeanour, her authenticity, her willingness to be in many photos and her generosity in terms of her time and her preparedness to answer our girls' searching questions and to allow them to hold her prized Olympic gold medal from the Paris Olympics, were wonderful. Bronte quickly put our fairly awestruck girls at ease, and I know that they will treasure her wise words and apply them, not only to their sporting lives, but to all their future life endeavours.
