Wellbeing – gratitude, connection and belonging

Gratitude, connection and a sense of belonging are vital to our wellbeing. In our Senior School chapel series, we've explored the 'outsiders' that Jesus interacted with in Luke's gospel. In Luke 17, Jesus heals 10 lepers, those separated and socially outcast from society. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks to Jesus. This passage reminds us of the importance of gratitude and appreciating the blessings we receive, a practice crucial for wellbeing.

Jesus' actions were counter-cultural, reaching out to those often ostracised in society, showing that true wellbeing includes both physical healing and spiritual restoration. By healing and accepting the Samaritan, who was doubly marginalised as both a leper and a foreigner, Jesus demonstrates his love for all. This love, shown through his death and resurrection, offers us deep connection and belonging through him.
